ORGANIZATION

<u>Hawai'i Pacific University</u> (HPU) is a private, not-for-profit institution with approximately 4,600 students coming from all 50 states, U.S. territories, and 65 countries. Founded in 1965, HPU is Hawai'i's largest private university, with a core campus at the heart of Honolulu's business district. HPU's investment in the urban student experience translates to greater hands-on experiences for student, expanded interdisciplinary collaboration between colleges and programs, and a deeper engagement within the community of Honolulu and the State of Hawai'i. HPU is currently recognized as having the most diverse student population in the nation. The University's student-centered approach and low student-faculty ratio of 16:1 naturally results in personal attention and one-on-one guidance.

The faculty, staff, students, and overall university community of HPU embrace the following values as representative of the spiritual, ethical, and philosophical principles that support our community, as well as of the aspirational ideals to which they collectively aspire.

- PONO, meaning righteous, honest and moral, and an energy of necessity.

Approximately 1,650 faculty and staff support multiple campuses and facilities in the islands. In addition to the main campus in downtown Honolulu, HPU has a 56-acre site that is home to marine science programs and an aquaculture research facility bordering the ocean in Makapu'u, O'ahu, plus a research feed mill located in Hilo, Hawai'i. HPU also has academic program presences at seven military installations (Pearl Harbor Naval Base, Hickam Air Force Base, Schofield Army Barracks, Fort Shafter, Tripler Army Medical Center, Marine Corps Base Hawai'i - Kāne'ohe, and Marine Corps Base Hawai'i - Camp H.M. Smith) while maintaining retail operations at Aloha Tower Marketplace and in Makapu'u.

HPU is poised to continue its development of top talent to maintain enrollment growth while preserving core cultural values - this necessitates unity and cohesion amongst faculty and staff in multiple locations. The Assistant Vice President of Human Resources (AVP) will be highly visible
